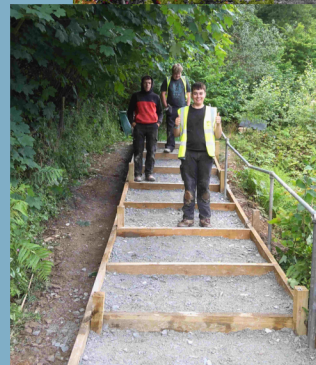
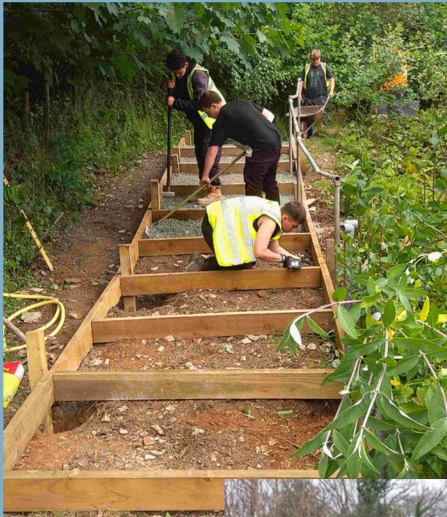




Group 4 have been diligently working on an upcycling furniture project, while also contributing at Tamar Valley Garden Nursery by constructing woodland steps.

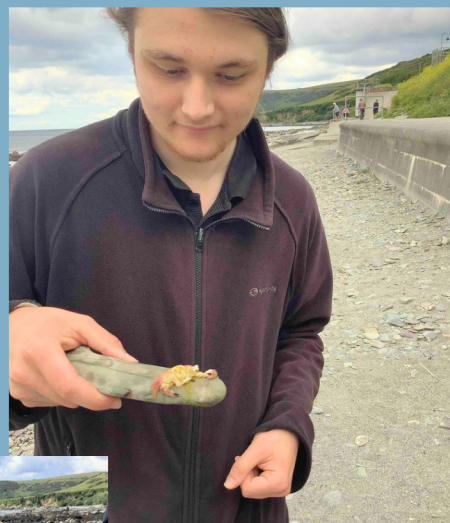

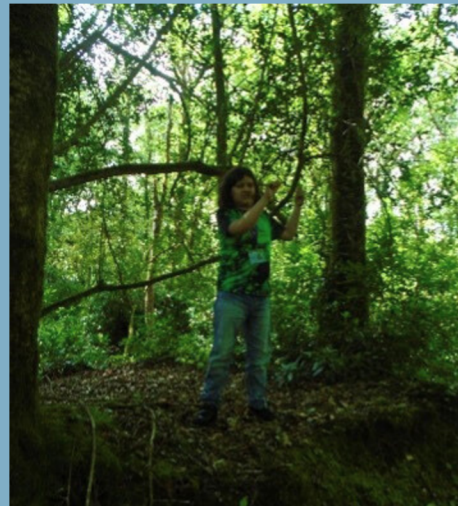
